Biography (Long Version)

born in Berlin, March 6, 1966

began playing cello at age five

scholarship at the Berlin Conservatory, 1977-84; classes in cello, piano, harmony, counterpoint, and ear training

early encounter with improvisation at age eight: cello teacher Prof.Eckle reads a fairy-tale and a group of students illustrates it through free improvisation

1983 and 1984 First Prize at the National Competition “Students Compose”

since 1983 - continues studying electric bass and double bass on his own motivation and starts playing in bands; jazz workshops in Berlin, Weickersheim, Vermont, Erlangen, and Munich

1983-89: collaboration with actress and singer Christa Lorenz; composes music for lyrics from Tucholsky, Mühsam, Scheerbart, etc for radio and theatrical productions

1985-90: studies journalism in Munich; continues playing and composing

1990/91 member of “Bundesjazzorchester”(National Jazz Orchestra) under the direction of Peter Herbolzheimer

1990 receives Music Award of the City of Munich

1991: lives in New York

1991: winner of the jazz competition at the convention of the “International Society of Bassists”

since 1992 teacher and instructor at jazz workshops in New York, Sydney, Lisbon, Graz, Berlin, Nuremberg, Stuttgart, Munich

1994 external exam at Richard-Strauss-Conservatory Munich

1994 Bavarian Music Award

1995-97: plays often with Stuttgart Radio Big Band ; concerts and CD productions with Phil Woods, Slide Hampton, Frank Foster and Manny Albam

1996 tour to Albania, Bosnien Herzegowina, Croatia, Serbia and Montenegro

1998 tour to South Africa and Namibia

1999-2001: plays regularly with the RIAS Big Band in Berlin; concerts and recordings with Richie Beirach, John Ruocco, Jim McNeely and Jens Winther

1999 european tour with Nils Wogram quartet (Ireland, Belgium, Germany, Netherlands, Switzerland, Austria, France)

2000 concerts for Goethe Institute in Istanbul, Naples, Budapest, Zagreb and Maribor

2014: **Artistic director at the "Tonspuren" festival** at Kloster Irsee (Bavaria), several premieres, eg the suite "Hexacor" for string orchestra and jazz double quartet (see double CD "Henning Sieverts: Hexacor")
